



















Mssion Statement & Action Items

Mission Statement



This Active Transportation¹ Plan will identify, and continually update, a network of existing and proposed cycling and pedestrian routes connecting places to live, work, shop, and recreate, while facilitating coordination, education, engagement, and funding among partners and stakeholders to promote a culture of Active Transportation in the Tri County Region.

¹Active transportation is any self-propelled human-powered mode of transportation, such as walking or bicycling.



Short Term Priorities

Prioritize improvements that fill gaps or barriers in the established regional network (The Active Transportation Backbone) and/or are on designated regional or area bike routes and greenways (PA State Bike Route J, US Bike Route 11, 911 Trail), and others.

- Immediate focus of implementation, TIP programming, and project development.
- Documented need, municipal/stakeholder support, feasibility/planning study completed.
- Ongoing or potential candidate TIP project.
- Connecting to or expanding existing facility.



Long Term Priorities

Further study of non-motorized connections to be implemented over the long term for regional or area networks (Greenbelt expansion, CVRT, SMTG, and others).

- Important regional connection or state-identified bicycle route requiring significant coordination among municipal partners and regional stakeholders.
- No feasibility/planning study (or significant issues found in feasibility/planning study).

 - Forge Road (South Middleton & Carlisle Borough)
 - Cumberland Valley Rail Trail
 - Conodoguinet Greenway
 - Gettysburg Road/Hummel Ave/Bike Route J
 - LeTort Trail

 - South Mountain Trolly Greenway
 - Carlisle to Mechanicsburg Connection

 - Route 34 Corridor

Incorporate bicycle-friendly measures and pedestrian connections in evolving land development and transportation projects (subdivision and developments, local road improvements, state highway maintenance).

- Collaborate with PennDOT District 8-0 and municipalities to pinpoint cost-effective enhancements for non-motorized transportation.
- Identify opportunities in roadway resurfacing projects (local or state), shoulder widening, travel lane reductions, and other proven traffic calming measures.
- Advocate for municipal ordinances mandating sidewalk facilities and wider cartway shoulders as
 alternatives to subjective SALDO waivers. If deferments are unavoidable, mandate escrow funding to
 ensure the construction of Active Transportation facilities later.
- Prioritize bike/ped access to parks and schools through municipal ordinances, Official Map inclusion, and grant pursuit for planning and implementation.
- Utilize PennDOT and local police crash data to inform Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Action Plans.

Build municipal awareness and capacity for non-motorized transportation.

- Encourage adoption of active transportation policies and plans (Complete Streets, Vision Zero, local/corridor-specific bike/ped plans, transit-oriented design).
- Promote adding proposed Active Transportation facilities to the Official Map.
- Convene annual roundtables with State Agencies, MPOs, County Planning Agencies, municipalities, and other stakeholders to discuss and coordinate Active Transportation efforts.
- Provide educational outreach to municipalities on creating Active Transportation plans and accessing federal/state funding.
- Enhance grant-writing and management capacity through collaborative multi-municipal efforts.
- Offer Active Transportation mapping and data resources for regional and local planning.
- Highlight economic benefits from "Return on Environment" studies in promoting Bike/Ped transportation opportunities.

Actively engage under-represented groups in Active Transportation Planning & Identify rural corridors for widened shoulders accommodating both horse and buggy routes and bike/ped needs.

- Ensure equitable distribution of Active Transportation infrastructure.
- Prioritize safe routes to schools and parks for children.
- Promote healthy living for older citizens through Active Transportation.
- Focus on prioritizing routes in urban neighborhoods.
- Support education and policy changes for a walking and biking culture.
- Incorporate Active Transportation goals in zoning and SALDO ordinances.
- Integrate eco/agro-tourism and economic development into bike and pedestrian planning.
- Engage local businesses, hospitality networks, and tourism agencies as stakeholders
